USDA Seeks Applications for Remaining Rural Disaster Home Repair Grants

*Funding Will Help People in Rural Areas Repair Homes Damaged by 2022
Presidentially Declared Disasters*

WASHINGTON, April 19, 2024 – U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development Under Secretary Dr. Basil Gooden today announced that USDA is seeking applications for the remaining funding under the [Rural Disaster Home Repair Grant Program](#).

USDA launched the program last year to help people repair or relocate homes damaged by calendar year 2022 [presidentially declared disasters](#). Through funding opportunities like this one, USDA stands ready to help people access the resources they need to rebuild their homes, their communities and their lives.

Approximately \$48.6 million in funding remains available. Individuals may apply to receive grants of up to \$42,920 until funds are expended.

Grants may be used to:

- pay for home repair expenses that were a result of a calendar year 2022 natural disaster or severe weather.
- prepare a site for a manufactured home.
- relocate a manufactured home.

To be eligible, applicants must have household incomes that do not exceed the [low-limits](#) based on their household size and county. Homes must be located in an [eligible rural area](#) and a Presidentially declared disaster area in 2022. Eligible counties are available online at [Disasters and Other Declarations | FEMA.gov](#).
