Tessa qualified for a USDA Rural Development Single Family Housing Direct Loan that allowed her to purchase a home that met her needs. She closed on the home on December 8, 2020 and started moving in. The home was exactly what she had envisioned and desired – a bright, beautiful, clean, and warm interior that included hard wood floors, new windows, and plenty of room, as well as offered a large backyard.

Tessa shared that she wakes up happy and is so grateful every day in her new home. Homeownership is much more achievable than one might think and more than likely less expensive than renting. She now has more room to spoil her two dogs and can easily visit her brother and his family that live only half a block away.

The federal funding was leveraged with a Homes Are Possible, Inc. (HAPI) silent mortgage of \$4,000 and a Grow South Dakota silent mortgage of \$7,500. HAPI packaged the loan.

"America prospers when our families prosper. Homeownership is key in creating that prosperity," said Lori Moen, Chief Operating Officer for Grow South Dakota. "The partnership opportunities that are formed between USDA Rural Development, Grow South Dakota and the homeowner are foundational links that build this prosperity and create stronger communities.
